Agnes Lavina Washington, daughter of the late Raphael and Elizabeth Curtis of Oxford, MD, peacefully departed this life on September 29, 2015 at Corsica Hills Nursing Center in Centreville, MD. Agnes was born on January 23, 1919. She was educated in Talbot County Public Schools. After graduation, Agnes became a teacher's aide. She later met and married Clayton Washington of Queenstown, MD. They were joined in holy matrimony on May 12, 1944 and remained together until Clayton's passing in 1997. Shortly after marriage, they moved to Baltimore, MD where Clayton found work. Out of this union were born three children, Carolyn, Clayton Jr, and Cheryl. Agnes spent her early years as a mother and housewife, before moving the family to Queenstown in 1950. Agnes spent many years working as a domestic for several prominent families in Queen Anne's County. She and her husband catered for the Kent Island Yacht Club for over 25 years. Agnes also loved making pies for friends, family and the church.

Agnes was an active member and officer of the King and Queen Social club. She loved to coordinate outfits for all of her and her husband's daily outings, even to the laundry mat. She loved to entertain and create elaborate luncheons and dinners, making sure no one left empty handed.

She began her Christian walk at Water's United Methodist Church in Oxford, MD. Upon moving to Queenstown, she joined Bryan's United Methodist Church, where she continued to worship until her death. She was a devoted choir member and officer. She was a member of the United Methodist Women

and served as president and devotional leader. As the senior member of Bryan's, her counsel was invaluable to pastors, parishioners and children alike. She received many awards and citations for her dedicated service to church and community.

Her life has left an indelible imprint on the lives of many. She had so much love to give and she illumined the lives of all she touched. Agnes committed her life to her family and her God.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Clayton and youngest daughter, Cheryl whose name she uttered almost daily.
