“ ALICE MAE KIRKLAND MITCHENER APRIL 8, 1933 - MARCH 26, 2020 Alice Mae Kirkland - \u201cThe Lady\u201d - was born April 8, 1933 to Minister Robert and Mattie E. Kirkland in Waynesboro, Georgia. She grew up with her parents whom preceded her to their present heavenly home and 8 siblings; two of which also preceded her - Gloria and George; in Baltimore, Maryland. She was a graduate of Dunbar High School, Essex Community College and the University of Baltimore. She married her high school sweetheart, James Henry Mitchener, November 17, 1957. He, too , preceded her to her present address in 2013. She became the first black woman to reside and become an active member of the Idlewood Community of Baltimore and the first black PTA member of Leith Walk Elementary School. She worked as a Supervisor of Medical Assistance ( the 1st Black Supervisor) for Baltimore County Department of Social Services until retiring in 1996. She leaves behind her son Kamal B.
