



## Allen William Daniels

August 19, 1919 - December 15, 2017

Allen William Daniels, 98, of Church Hill, Maryland, son of the late William Daniels and Lydia Brooks Daniels Spencer, enter into eternal rest on December 15, 2017, at Our Home in The Country 2, assistance living facility, Colemans, Maryland.

Allen, born on the 19th of August, 1919, in Pondtown, Maryland, was inducted in the US Army on July 29, 1943, where he served his country in World War II. He received the Good Conduct Medal, the European Service Medal, and a World War II Victory Ribbon. He received an Honorable Discharge December 27, 1945.

Allen returned home to Pondtown, November 1, 1946. He married Eleanore V. Matthews. To support his family, Allen worked as a farmer and on the railroad. Later he started working for the Campbell Soup Company, in Chestertown, Maryland. He loved to fish and hunt. Most days after he retired, you would find him in the back yard rebuilding lawnmowers for various people. He was a member of the National Church of God, Pondtown, under the leadership of the late Reverend Beatrice Spencer, where he served as Deacon.

Allen was preceded in death by one daughter, Eva L. Combs; 4 sisters, Margaret Wilson, Beatrice Spencer, Lillian Sanders and Elsie Hynson; and three brothers, Leon Daniels, Charles Spencer and William Daniels.

Allen leaves to cherish his memory, his wife of 71 years, Eleanore V. Daniels; sons, William A. Daniels of Church Hill, MD, Ted Jackson (Shanqutoshia) of Church Hill, MD and Clifton Seeney of Milford, DE; one sister-in-law, Bettie Spencer of Pondtown, three grandsons; five granddaughters; two great-granddaughters; 11 great-great grandchildren; and a host of foster sons and daughters, nieces, nephews and friends.
