Allison Victoria Parker of Hurlock, Maryland took wings on Tuesday, May 5, 2015 at Peninsula Regional Medical Center, Salisbury, Maryland surrounded by her loving family. She was 64. She was born on April 8, 1951 in Cambridge, Maryland. She was the second daughter of the late Alfred Henry Parker and the late Demar Enola Woolford Parker.

Allison was educated in Dorchester County schools graduating from North Dorchester High School in the class of 1969. She worked for 25 plus years upon graduation at Coldwater Seafood, Cambridge, MD.
