Alton Kemp Brown of Grasonville, MD died on Friday, January 13, 2017 at The Compass Hospice in Centreville, MD. Born on November 8, 1954 to the late Leslie Kemp Brown and his surviving mother Florence A. Brown. He was 62 years old.

"Hawkman," as he was affectionately known by family and close friends, graduated from Queen Anne's County High School in June, 1973. As being self-employed, Alton really loved being on the water as a Waterman. No matter man, woman, or child he never left a person on shore. He also loved being a bus driver for Queen Anne's County Public School, especially the sports teams.
