Annie (Anna) Margaret Mary Lee Irvin (Irving) age 72 of Frankford, Delaware, passed away peacefully on Monday, July 17, 2017, at the Delaware Hospice Center in Milford, Delaware, surrounded by her family.

Annie was born in Milford. She was the daughter of the late William Irvin and Dilly (Mamie) Bradshaw Irvin. Annie was raised by Annie Roland and Isadora Cabell.
