"Bart", "Daddy" "Pop Pop" "Mule" and "ABC" as he was affectionately called by family and friends, was warm, kind, and always there to help everyone. He was known for his great sense of humor and his ability to fill any room he entered with laughter. He was down to earth, very outspoken and a man of integrity and extremely wise. Bart loved his family and would do anything to make them happy. He enjoyed family, he and his aunts, uncles and cousins would always travel from house to house playing pinnacle, all night long, rotating turns at the table. He was a lover of God's creations - always being outside in the yard keeping it nice and trimmed, always building sheds, wooded benches, decks etc. planting his garden or on his boat fishing or just relaxing on the water.

On Sundays he would attend church and ride his motorcycle. Other times you could find him eating ice cream with Sarah and his great grandchildren, giving them anything they wanted. Bartholomew was employed at various places: Cold Water Seafood, Campbell Soup Company, Peninsula Regional Medical Center, Citizen Gas Company and Dealers Building Supply in Salisbury, MD, from where he retired. He also enjoyed his part-time job at Wade's Repair Service and Westside Mini Market both located in Nanticoke, MD until his health no longer made it possible for him to continue working. He was a past member and Past Patron of the Lebanon Lodge No. 37 in Nanticoke, MD and a member of a motorcycle club, that he and his wife enjoyed riding with on Sunday afternoons. Bartholomew

was also a Bonded Certified Locksmith.

Bartholomew received his Christian walk at a young age at Freedman's A.U.M.P. Church in Tyaskin, MD. He was baptized in June, 2012. He re-dedicated his life to Christ and attended Rapture Ready Ministries, Inc., Salisbury, MD until his Father called his home to rest.
