Betty Ann Tilghman, age 78, passed away on Sunday, August 9, 2015 at Anchorage Nursing Home in Salisbury, MD. She was born on January 13, 1937 in Salisbury, MD to the late Issac Coulbourne Sr. and Catherine Collins Coulbourne who preceded her in death in 1981 and 1989 respectively.
