



## Blandie Kellam

June 23, 1935 - March 18, 2019

Blandie Kellam, Jr., age 83, of Seaford, Delaware, passed away on Monday, March 18, 2019.

Blandie was born in Cape Charles, Virginia, and grew up in Seaford, Delaware. He attended Frederick Douglass School in Seaford. He was employed with Wilbert Frylings, Soil Service, Oasis Car Wash and had his own Lawn Care Services in Seaford.

Early in life, Blandie was a member of Clarence Street Church of God and of Refuge Temple Revival Center, both in Seaford, Delaware. His most recent membership was at Clarence Street Church of God under the pastorage of Bishop Carlton Cannon, Jr. He was a faithful usher, chauffeur, sang on the men's choir and kept the church grass manicured for many years. He would help to do anything that he was asked to do, if he could, until he became ill and could no longer serve.

Blandie loved to fish with his friends and his son-in-law. He was loved by all the children in the Lakewood neighborhood. He would have neighborhood baseball games in his back yard, where all the children in the neighborhood would come and participate. Blandie sold frozen cups and ice cream in the neighborhood for years. He also served his country as an officer in the Army National Guard.

Blandie was united in Holy Matrimony to the late Elizabeth Thomas Kellam, and they had four children; two sons, Blandie Lee Kellam, III (April) and Marcelle Kellam (Sherry) and two daughters, Sondonia Worthy (Elijah) and Denise Mumford (Edward). Blandie was gifted with eight grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

He is preceded in death by his parents, Blandie, Sr., and Elanor Kellam; three brothers, George Kellam, Willie James Kellam and Leon Kellam; three sisters, Sadie Johnson, Sally Kellam and Catherine Fortt, and a granddaughter, Deshawn Kellam.

Blandie leaves to mourn, his wife of 26 years, Shirley T. Kellam; four children, 16 grandchildren, one brother, Alvin Kellam and one sister, Lillie May Archie; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, acquaintances and in-laws.
