Carol Nathaniel Stewart, Jr. (Radar) departed this life on Saturday, February 20, 2016 at Nanticoke Memorial Hospital in Seaford, Delaware. Nate was the son of the late Carol Sr. and Ruby Crump-Stewart. Nate was born in New Kent County, Virginia on October 21, 1948 and moved to Delaware at an early age. After his mother passed away when he was only a few days old, his maternal grandparents, Henry and Lorraine Crump stepped in to raise him along with his sister, Rose. There was also his stepmother, Dorothy Stewart; his aunts, Mildred Sample and Evelyn Bradley who also aided in his upbringing. Once he moved to Delaware, he lived on Lowe's Crossroad with his grandparents, aunts, uncles, and cousins. He attended Ross Point Elementary School and William C Jason Comprehensive High School. In 1967, he enlisted in the military and served in the United States Marine Corps. While in the Marine Corps, Nate served in Vietnam in combat and he had no problem letting you know that he was a combat veteran. He was honorably discharged in 1973.

After serving in the Marine Corps, Nate worked at several different jobs: Bethlehem Steel, John Wannamaker Dresser Wayne Pump and finally he became a DJ which seemed to suit him well. He often told me of the different shows he promoted and brought different bands to Cambridge, Maryland. To hear him tell it, he and Tommy Trotter were it."

Nate is survived by his wife, Tambara and her children; two sons, Nathan J. Jenkins of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and Nathaniel C Hill of Washington,

DC; two granddaughters, Anya Dorsey of Chester, Pennsylvania and Charlie Autumn Hill of Upper Marlboro, Maryland; two brothers, Larry (Dola) Stewart and Randy Stewart of Laurel, Delaware; Rose Marie (Jimmy) Houston of Seaford, Delaware, Vanessa (Joe) Deloach of Millsboro, Delaware, Trudy Hammond of Delmar, Maryland; one aunt, Evelyn Bradley; four uncles, Hugo (Ruth) Crump, Ben Sample, Earnest Snead and Harold Snead; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
