



Cathryn Sullivan "Noonie" Wallace

August 16, 1922 - April 18, 2018

Cathryn Sullivan Wallace was born August 16, 1922, to the late William and Charlotte Sullivan. At the time of her homegoing she was ninety-five years of age.

“Noonie” as we called her, was a product of the Talbot County Education System, graduating from Moton High School.

Cathryn was the first black employee of the former Trader’s Drug Store in Easton, Maryland. She also worked as the Housekeeping Supervisor at The Pasadena Inn, in Royal Oak, Maryland.

A direct descendent of the late Reverend Alexander W. Wayman, seventh bishop of the A.M.E. Church. She grew up in the traditions of African Methodism. She was a member of Black Blackston Auxiliary Unit #77.

She was joined in holy matrimony to Joseph Toward Wallace, on September 23, 1950. Their lives together reflected an unwavering devotion to each other.

Aunt Noonie leaves to cherish her memory, her step daughter Joanna Hinton; sister-in-law, Nellie Sullivan; devoted nephew/son, Carlette Sullivan; and host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and many friends. Cathryn was preceded in death by six brothers and two sisters.
