I can't explain it, but I had a sudden feeling he had passed away, checked Facebook, and learned the sad news that he was taken from us far too early.

Clyde, I will miss you dearly and I will always, always love you. You were a good, strong and decent man. Thank you for being one of the influences that saved my life. You made a bigger difference than you realized.

And I apologize, despite promising to do so, I did not sit down and practice Thunderstruck so that I could send you a videotape of me playing it some day. But thank you so much for teaching me how on that one last night a few years ago.
