Charles E. Marshall, Sr. of Dover, DE passed away on Wednesday, October 22, 2014.

He was born on March 6, 1934 in Dover, DE. He was the son of James H. Marshall and Glennie Murray Marshall. He was the grandson of Rev. Henry J. Marshall, founder of Little Mission Church, predecessor of Union Missionary Baptist Church.
