Charles Edward Mosley of Millsboro, Delaware, born to the late George Mosley and Melvina Abram on Thursday May 15, 1924 in Canterbury, Delaware, departed this life on Thursday October 5, 2017 at the age of 93.

Charles graduated from Delaware State College (now University) where he received his degree in Elementary Education.

Charles was a very ambitious man and during his career, he was a school teacher, worked at a nursing home in Seaford, Delaware, and owned his own dump truck and grass cutting businesses.
