Roy McNair passed away unexpectedly in Atlanta, Georgia on the 15th of November 2017. He was born in Laurinburg, North Carolina to Emily McDonald and grew up in Chicago before entering the U.S. Air Force as a young man.

While in the Air Force, Roy traveled the world, including a tour of duty in Vietnam. He retired from the Air Force in 1972, with over 20 years of service.
