April 9, 1936 - June 26, 2017

Daniel Richard Wongus, age 81, departed this life on Monday, June 26, 2017. He was born on Thursday, April 9, 1936 in Rhodesdale, Maryland; son of the late Willie (Will) and Isabella Bowens Wongus.

Daniel attended Hurlock Elementary School and graduated from Mace's Lane High School in Cambridge, Maryland, Class of 1954. Daniel worked and retired from Maryland Plastics in Federalsburg, Maryland in April of 2000. He also worked at Nanticoke Cleaners in Seaford, Delaware, as a presser; at Walmart in Cambridge, Maryland, as a greeter; and part-time at Parole and Probation in Cambridge, Maryland.

Daniel was saved on September 10, 1995 at the National Church of God, in East New Market, Maryland, under the leadership of Elder Howard Spencer. He later changed his membership to Wallace Temple in Rhodesdale under the leadership of Reverend William Dent. There, he was Reverend Dent's armor bearer, assistant class leader and a member of the Pastor's Aide Committee. After moving to Cambridge, he changed his membership to Refuge Temple Church of God. While at Refuge, he was a greeter, an usher, and sang in the Sanctuary Choir and the Male Chorus.

Daniel was preceded in death by 6 brothers, James, Willie, Charles, Stephen and Otho Wongus and Edward Ross and 3 sisters, Ida Macer, Dora Jones

and Isabella Wongus.

Daniel is survived by his son, Daniel Darnell Hopkins (Dorothy) and a grandson, Darius Hopkins, all of Seaford, DE; a sister, Dorothy Baynard (Albert) of Federalsburg, MD and a niece, Floretta Austin of Seaford, DE, whom he helped raise as a daughter; a very special friend, Brenda Magee of Federalsburg, MD, and many nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
