Donald Lee Maddox, a longtime resident of Marion Station, Maryland, passed from earth to glory on Friday, March 26, 2021 at home surrounded by his family. After a courageous battle with cancer, Donald was called home at the age of seventy (70) to rest with his Lord and Savior.
