Dorothy Ann Sisco departed this life on March 11, 2024 at home. She was born on November 27, 1948 in Rock Hall, MD. Dorothy was the daughter of the late Emmett Sisco and Sadie Sisco.

Dorothy attended Sharptown Elementary for her early education. She continued her education at Garnett High School, from where she graduated. Later in life, Dorothy received numerous certifications from the state of Maryland in Food Service Sanitation Management. In 2008, she received a certification from Chesapeake College for the completion in the Reiki Method of Natural Healing.

Dorothy worked at Magnolia Hall for several years in the kitchen. She was hired by Sheriff Allan Blizzard on September 16, 1988 as a part-time cook in the jail. On August 28, 1989, she was promoted to Food Service Manager. In 2010, she was Employee of the Year, alongside her sister Grace. Ms. Dorothy ended her career with the county after almost twenty-three (23) years of cooking for the Detention Center.

Dorothy was a God-fearing woman. She started her spiritual journey as a child in Aaron's Chapel in Rock Hall and was baptized on November 19, 1995. In 1999, she became a devoted member of The Potter's House Ministries. She

then became a licensed minister under the leadership of Bishop Charles Tilghman. She was one of Bishop's favorite encouragers. Dorothy was also head of the kitchen committee, an usher, and she taught a cooking class at the church. She supported the church spiritually, physically, and financially until her health prohibited her from doing so.

In addition to her parents Dorothy was preceded in death by her son, Terence L. Hynson, Sr., her brother, William E., and sister/best friend, Ella Mae Blake.

Dorothy leaves to cherish her memory: her brother, George and sister Grace; three grandchildren, Destiny, Terence, Jr. and Cheyenne; two great-grandchildren, Tiyanye and Honess; nieces, Dorothy "Dotsy", Marja and Lehanne; nephew, Lamont and a host of family and friends.
