EDWARD RANDOLPH SEENEY was born to the late Randolph and Dorothy Seeney on July 27, 1941 in Chester, Pennsylvania. Edward, also known as Eddie, departed this life on May 23, 2022 following a brief stay at Manokin Manor in Princess Anne, Maryland.

Eddie grew up in Chester, Pennsylvania where he was educated at Watts Elementary, Douglas Junior High and Chester High schools. He left high school to enlist in the United States Army and serve his country where he was a Paratrooper, Sniper and Drill Sergeant. He also served as a combat soldier in Vietnam for two tiers and one in Korea, risking his life for his country. After twenty plus years of service, he retired with honors. He then was a correctional officer at Gratorford Prison in Pennsylvania where he again almost lost his life in service.

Eddie enjoyed music and dancing, partying, and joking around and he enjoyed the company of many friends. While in the Army, stationed in Fort Bragg, North Carolina, Eddie (then known as SEENEY), through his friend Hanera Barnes, met and married Delois Ann Buie. Eddie lived life to the fullest, leaving almost no stone unturned, ending up in Florida with his then wife, Janice Waddell (who preceded him in death). After being reunited with his daughter Judy, Eddie moved to Salisbury Maryland and became an active

member of True Faith Deliverance and Outreach Ministries, pastored by his daughter Judy, where he would live out the rest of his days.

Eddie was preceded in death by both parents, his brother, Albert Seeney and his sister, Marilyn Seeney- Kerbo (Albert).
