His faithful love of the Lord, gardening, dogs and family is well known, and he later enjoyed bingo at his assisted living residence, and was well loved by his wonderful caregivers and neighbors and all who knew him. He was a lifelong vegetarian, and is survived by three sons Ed Jr. of Harbeson, Tim of Rehoboth Beach and Glenn of Smyrna, De and all who miss him dearly.
