Elizabeth Mae Winder, daughter of the late Warren Smullen, Sr. and Sophia Mae Smullen, was born in Wicomico County, in San Domingo Community in Sharptown, MD, on May 2, 1939. She was the eldest of three children. Elizabeth departed this life on Sunday, October 1, 2017 unexpectedly.

She was educated in the Wicomico County public school system. Elizabeth attended Salisbury High School and furthered her education in New Jersey by obtaining her Bachelor's and Master's Degree from Trenton State College.

She was united in holy matrimony to Fulton Winder of Laurel, Delaware for 58 years and became a Military Dependent. In that capacity, she was afforded the opportunity to travel extensively throughout the country until her husband's retirement from the United States Army. She then settled in both Willingboro, New Jersey and finally Sharptown, Maryland. From her marriage, she was blessed with two sons, Orlando and Efrem.

She was also excited about re-kindling old relationships upon relocating to the Sharptown Community. She often said that since she has been away “us teenagers became old people” and laughed.

She was preceded in death by her parents and one brother, Warren Smullen, Jr.
