Evelyn Othelia Rowe Reid, 86, of Middletown, Delaware, passed away at Christina Hospital on May 13, 2019. Evelyn was born on December 13, 1932, in Sassafras, Maryland, to the late William Raymond Rowe and Laura V. Goldsborough Rowe.

Evelyn's early education began at Olivet Hill Elementary in Galena, Maryland. She later attended H. H. Garnet School in Chestertown, Maryland. After graduating from Garnet in 1949, Evelyn then attended Bowie State Teacher's College, graduating with a bachelor's degree. Evelyn then taught at Garnet School and Sharptown/Rock Hall. She moved to Rockford, Illinois, in 1966, continuing to teach. She received her Master's degree in 1988, from the University of Illinois. Evelyn taught at Hall Elementary and Rock River Elementary. In addition, she served as principal. She retired from Lewis Lemon Global Studies Academy in 2003.

From 2003 - 2006, Evelyn served as the professor of Elementary Supervisors for student teachers at Rockford College. Evelyn finally retired from education in 2006.

Evelyn moved back to the East Coast in 2013, settling in Middletown, Delaware.

Evelyn attended Allen Chapel A.M.E. Church in Rockford, Illinois. After moving to Middletown, she became a member of Rehoboth Church of God Apostolic.

Along with her parents, Evelyn was preceded in death by five brothers, two sisters, and three infant Rowe babies. She is survived by one sister, Thelma R. Pennick (Sassafras, MD); a devoted niece, Sheila Rowe Butler (Sassafras, MD); a niece that she raised, Wendy Young (Jimmy) (Georgetown, MD); one sister-in-law, Rosalie Rowe (Chestertown, MD); four grandchildren; seven great-grandchildren, special friends, Meriam Groce Spriggs, Annie Davis, Melvina Jenkins, Elvira Moye and Lu Parham; many other nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
