Obituary

Fredia Hargis was born on November 27, 1954 to the late Fred & Sarah Irby at Kings County Hospital in Brooklyn, NY, the youngest of three children.

Fredia graduated from Maxwell Vocational High School. After graduation, Fredia wore “many hats” but realized she had a talent for taking care of older people. She received a plaque from the Renaissance Retirement Home for the Elderly for her dedicated service. Later, she also worked for the Kingsborough Housing Development in Brooklyn, NY. While working at Kingsborough, Fredia met and married her “beloved” husband, Robert Hargis. At an early age, Fredia began her spiritual journey in 1967 when she joined the New Jerusalem Holiness Church in Brooklyn, NY, under the leadership of Bishop James L. Cochran and later Bishop Lester C. Smith.

Fredia and Robert, whom she affectionately called her “Boo,” moved to Salisbury, MD in 1994. Fredia then gained employment at Roses Department Store where she was a dedicated worker and affectionately known as the “Leopard Lady” until her health failed.
