



Fulton James Winder Jr.

March 1, 1938 - December 24, 2020

On December 24, 2020 we lost our father Fulton James Winder, Jr of Mardela Springs, MD to a long battle with COVID 19. Our father proudly served in the US Army for 20 years and 8 months before retiring honorably as an E8 Master Sergeant. During his military career he was awarded the Bronze Star for bravery, served two tours of duty in Viet Nam, was stationed over season in Panama, Korea, and numerous state side postings with his last two years being assigned to Charlie Guard, the oldest unit in the US Military, and was part of the team assigned to guarding the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington National Cemetery in Virginia.

He was predeceased in death by his parents and his loving wife of 59 years, Elizabeth Smullen of Mardela Springs and 5 brothers.

Fulton is survived by 2 sons. His eldest Orlando Winder and wife of Deland, Florida and Efrem Winder and wife of Junction City, Kansas. He had 12 grand children and 18 great grandchildren, a brother Leon Winder of Delmar DE., a brother-in-law, retired Colonel Melvin Smullen of Mardela Springs MD as well as many nieces and nephews and friends.
