Gerald Otis Turner, Sr., of 5645 Gates Street, Royal Oak (Bellevue), MD passed away on Saturday, March 9, 2013 at the age of 81. He was the son of the late Howard Otis and Harriett Turner.

Gerald graduated from Moton High School in 1948. He joined the U. S. Air Force and served as an Aircraft Engineer.
