Gregory Cornelius Sparks, better known as Greg, passed at the age of 57 on the morning of Saturday, December 6, 2014, 7:45 a.m., at INOVA Fair Oaks Hospital in Fairfax, Virginia. He was born on July 25, 1957 to the late Kenneth and Sylvia Sparks of Chestertown, Maryland at Kent & Queen Anne's Hospital. He received his education in the Kent County Public School System and graduated from Kent County High School in 1975. During his school experience, he was deeply involved in basketball, baseball, and the marching band.

After graduating high school, he joined the United States Navy, serving for six years until May 26, 1982. After the Navy, Greg began a career as an accomplished Network Engineer of over 30 years.
