Hallie was born in Venton, Maryland on June 22, 1930, and educated in the Somerset County public school system. At an early age, Hallie became a member of the Grace United Methodist Church in Venton, Maryland where she regularly attended summer school and other activities at the church. Later in life she served on several committees as well as the choir. She was a dynamite seamstress, a great hair dresser and a wonderful cook.
