He thought maybe it was because he had four sisters and three brothers, and could not be raised up with them. So he left home at 16 and ended up in CC Camp until World War II.

In 1943, he was drafted into the Navy. He served two years outside the United States in the South Pacific as a Steward's Mate First Class. Honorably Discharged January 26th 1946 with five letters behind his name Harold T. Conquest USANR (United States of America Navy Recruit) and he is not a professor.

He met and married Margie M. (Collick) Conquest. They lived in Brooklyn, NY. For nine years then built a home and moved back to Delaware.

He joined Mt. Carmel Church September 1984 and served as a Deacon and was active in community services ministry.
