Haywood Davis "H.D." Elliott, the youngest of eight children was born on August 31, 1922 to the late Samuel George Elliott and Elizabeth Davis Elliott in Pondtown, MD. He departed this life on Sunday evening, June 22, 2014 at Chesapeake Caregivers, Inc., Trapp, MD at the age of 91.

H.D was educated at Pondtown School. He was honorably discharged from the Army on October 25, 1945. He met and married Jessie Elizabeth Brown on September 21, 1946. They were married for 50 years, when she died on December 23, 1996.

H.D. was employed by Conrail Railroad as a welder. After retirement he was a bus driver for the Crumpton Senior Center. H.D. was a member of the American Legion Post the Mt. Pleasant United Methodist Church, the Senior Choir, Men's Choir and the Mt. Pleasant Singers and the Chester River Hospital Auxiliary. He loved playing the guitar and riding motorcycles.
