Henry H. Dantzler passed away peacefully at his home on Wednesday, August 8, 2018.

Hank was born July 4, 1932, in St. George, South Carolina, to the late Burbank and Cora (Stewart) Dantzler. Hank had one sibling, younger sister, Betty Dantzler Camp, who also preceded him in death.
