HOWARD FREDERICK BAKER of Dover, Delaware quietly passed away at the Delaware Veterans Home in Milford, Delaware on Tuesday, June 27, 2017, at the age of 89. Howard was born on Saturday, February 11, 1928, in Leavenworth, Kansas to the late Lucien and Genevieve Brown Baker.

Howard received his formal education from the public schools in Leavenworth, Kansas. He went on to earn his bachelor's degree from Delaware State University and his masters from Central Michigan University. Howard retired from the United States Air Force after serving 21 years as a Chaplin's Assistant. He then began his second career with Child Protective Services for the state of Delaware.

Howard has been a faithful member of Whatcoat United Methodist Church since the early 1970's. He served in several areas including the Usher Board and he also attended Bible Study.
