Irene T. Brittingham (Candy) was born in Fort Gaines, Georgia on January 24, 1936. Irene was the daughter of the late Isaac and Cassie Thompson. On July 25, 2016, Irene Brittingham passed away at Courtland Manor Nursing home in Dover, Delaware.

Irene attended Benjamin Banneker School in Milford, and William Henry School in Dover, Delaware. She was a dedicated employee at Fisherman Wharf Restaurant. She enjoyed volunteer work at the Just Soup Ministry.
