



Jack Ira Wallace Sr.

October 13, 1930 - July 2, 2018

In the early morning hours of July 2, 2018, Jack Ira Wallace, Sr., took an early morning nonstop flight to Glory, to a promised place in the presence of our King. Jack was born in Covington, Virginia, to his mother, Rosa L. Wallace, and a father whose name we do not know. At age four, his mother, Rosa, died, leaving him to be raised by his grandmother, Mary.

Living in the shadow of the Great Depression, Jack often used cardboard in the bottom of his shoes where his soles had worn away. Navy beans for dinner nearly every day didn't stop Jack from growing up mentally sharp and physically strong.

Jack graduated from Watson High School in 1948, and shortly thereafter, joined the U.S. Air Force. He returned home to marry his childhood sweetheart, Rosamary Hunter, in 1954. By 1956, they were the proud parents of two little boys, Jack Jr., and Anthony, and they enjoyed seeing the world both here and abroad.

Jack retired from the Air Force after 27 years of distinguished service. He logged more than 30,000 flight hours in various aircraft. He was an Aircraft Mechanic, Load Master, Crew Chief, Flight Engineer Instructor and Examiner.

Afterward, he worked as a shift supervisor at International Playtex, and

earned a B.S., in Business Administration from Delaware State College. Jack also loved Jesus. He loved the Scriptures and could often be heard reciting Psalm 19:7-14 by heart. He was a charter member of Crossroad Christian Church, and served faithfully in various capacities through the years. He was an inspiration, a mentor, model, and motivator to many people.

Elder Papa Jack, as he is affectionately known, leaves to cherish his memory, his loving wife, Rosamary; two sons, Jack Jr. (Asmaa) and Anthony (Margo); five grandchildren, six greatgrandchildren, two great-great-grandchildren; and a host of other relatives from sea to shining sea. He was greatly blessed.

He will be greatly missed.
