



## James Edward Jenkins

May 31, 1930 - February 23, 2019

Deacon James Edward Jenkins, Sr., better known as “Jim”, began his life’s journey on May 31, 1930. He was born to the late Beatrice Jenkins and James “Kemp” Collins, in Seaford, Delaware. He completed his journey on February 23, 2019, at Genesis Seaford Center.

He attended Frederick Douglass School in Seaford, Delaware. He was employed by Donald Johnson as a farmer for more than 45 years.

In his spare time, Jim loved gardening, killing hogs, hunting wild game and spending time with family. He also enjoyed watching westerns and the Baltimore Orioles.

James accepted the Lord as his personal Savior and started his journey as a member at Clarence Street Church of God, Seaford, Delaware, under the leadership of Reverend Isaac Brunson. He worked faithfully in the church. He was a Deacon, sang on the Men’s Choir, Usher and Devotional Leader when asked. Each Sunday evening after dinner, he would go to the church to count and deposit the finances.

On June 18, 1977, James and Elizabeth were joined in holy matrimony. After 27 years of marriage, Jim became ill, and spent 14 years at Genesis. His loving wife spent time every day with him, and on Sundays she would share

the Sunday School lesson with him.

In addition to his parents, James was preceded in death by seven sisters, Pauline Hyland, Mable Ricketts, Bertha Nutter, Lucy Collins, Sarah Waples, Frances Jenkins and Patricia Washington; two brothers, Wilmer Jenkins and Oscar Jenkins; and son-in-law, Tyrone McGlotten.
