June was a religious woman, first becoming a member of New Rochelle Seventh Day Adventist Church and then transferring her membership to White Plains Seventh Day Adventist. When June retired, her new dedication turned to the Seaford, Delaware Seventh Day Adventist Church. They welcomed her with open arms and made her feel at home.

June worked two jobs at times and overtime to provide for her sons so that they would never need or want anything in their lives. She had a work ethic that soon would turn her attention to real estate. This venture allowed her to put a roof over someone's head even though at times collecting rent was truly sporadic.

June's religious life guided her heart to care for her fellow man, woman and child, donating clothes to anyone in need and feeding anyone who was hungry. June's strong faith allowed her to live every day putting someone else's needs ahead of her own.

I (Mark) was able to express my gratification more than once for the sacrifices that June Rose Anderson made for me. Yes, I learned a lot growing up, but even more in the last few years.
