



Lady Jacqueline Marie Johnson

January 13, 1948 - December 16, 2020

Jacqueline Maria Theresa Robinson Johnson, daughter of the late William Henry Robinson, Sr. and Nellie Mae Davison Robinson, was born on January 13, 1948 at McKeesport Hospital in McKeesport, Pennsylvania. She peacefully went home to be with the Lord on Wednesday, December 16, 2020.

Jacque completed her education in Elizabeth, Pennsylvania and graduated from Elizabeth Forward High School in 1965. She started working that year at Haines Supermarket, then went to work at First Federal Savings and Loan in Southland Shopping Center and later transferred to a bank in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania until 1974.

In 1975, Jacque married the man of her dreams, Weldon M. Johnson and moved to Princess Anne, Maryland. In 1975, she became the first black teller at Peninsula Bank and in 1978 became the first black Deputy Clerk at the Circuit Court for Somerset County where she held the following positions: Deputy Clerk, Courtroom Clerk, Paternity Clerk, Criminal Clerk and finally Somerset County Criminal Supervisor. Jacque retired in October 2016 after serving thirty-eight (38) years in the court system.

In 1990, Jacque with her husband, traveled to Cambridge where the ministry which is now New Life Christian Church and Ministries, Inc. began. Lady Johnson loved her family and church family but most of all, she loved God.

In addition to her parents, William Henry and Nellie Mae Robinson, she was preceded in death by a brother, William Henry Robinson, Jr., a sister, Avais Felder and granddaughters, Ava and Savannah Johnson-Lockman.
