Larrine Viola West-Brown, affectionately known as “Moma” or “Honey West”, a resident of Cambridge, Maryland, departed this life in the early hours of Monday, May 6, 2019 as she slept peacefully in her home. She was called home to the Lord at the age of seventy (70) after many years of battling breast cancer. She was born on February 20, 1949 in Cambridge, Maryland, the daughter of the late Larry Edward West and Irene Dorothy Fletcher-West.
