Obituary

Larry Darnell Granby took his journey home on March 25, 2018 at Peninsula Regional Medical Center in Salisbury, Maryland.

Born in Birdsnest, Virginia on March 5, 1955, he was the son of the late Willie Granby and Cornelius Rose Granby.

Larry attended Mace's Lane School in Cambridge, Maryland. After his military service, he went back to school to receive his high school diploma in 1994.

Larry joined the United States Army in 1972. During his time of active duty, he worked as a Track Vehicle Mechanic. Larry received the National Defense Service Medal, Sharpshooter Badge and Expert Badge. His time in service ended with an honorable discharge in 1978. Later, Larry was employed by the Epilepsy Association in Hebron, Maryland. In 1998, Larry attended Delaware Tech Industrial Education and completed the course to become a Tractor Trailer Driver. He then began working for five years as a truck driver for Canada Dry. Afterwards, he worked as a truck driver for Chesapeake Waste Industries.

Larry was a member of American Legion Post #269 and served as the Post

Commander from 1996-1997. He loved fishing, crabbing and cooking on the grill for family and friends.
