I had just seen you at the nursing home about a week before and you told me over in over again Davette I want to go home.

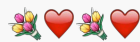
Mrs.Lauretta are are now home with your son Bruce, your husband Cleveland, your mom Mrs.Lula, and Mickie.

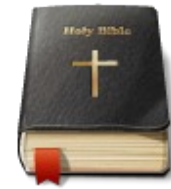
