Leroy F. Tiggs, was born to James and Emma Tiggs, on March 8th in the year of 1944, in Virginia. He was one of eight siblings. He attended William C. Jason Comprehensive High School and enjoyed playing baseball while there. Later in life, he developed a love for classic cars and trucks, which earned him the name “Night Crawler.” He began his profession at Perdue Farms. He was a dedicated employee for 49 years, as a truck driver and a trainer for the company’s drivers. After his passing, the company honored his service by blowing their horns for one week, each day, at noon.

Leroy was a father, grandfather, husband and a friend. He reached out to families, not only to those related by blood, but to those who crossed his path and became family through faith and friendship. The family flourished and grew because of Leroy’s devotion and willingness to always put his family and friends first.

Leroy was a storyteller, a life coach and a man who did not hesitate to help his loved ones, sometimes before they realized they needed help. When advice was needed, he gave it. When someone needed to be heard, he listened. And when you needed someone to go out to eat with, he was always ready to join you at the table. From his “office”, his favorite seat in the kitchen, he watched over his family until he was called home the Lord, on April 20, 2021.

Leroy married Susanne Williams, on December 28, 1968, and they remained married for 52 years. Their union gave them three sons, Samuel, Julius and Tony; five grandchildren; and one great-grandchild.

Leroy joined Bethel A.M.E. Church in Milford, Delaware, more than twenty years ago, on Valentine's day, under the former shepherd, Pastor James Hill. He was a member of the Usher and Trustee Boards. He was also a part of the Breakfast Club, under the current pastor, Reverend Jean A. Wylie.

Leroy was preceded in death by his parents as well as his brothers, Chester and Pete.

Leroy is survived by his wife; three sons; sisters, Mary, Ethel and Catherine; and brothers, Gerald and Bill.
