Leslie met the love of her life Willie Ray Pettie in the year of 1953. They were married shortly after in 1954 in Community Baptist Church, New York City. After marriage, she worked in New York as a secretary for West Chester County Administration where she retired.

Upon receiving the Holy Spirit in Pennsville, New Jersey, a ministry was born. Leslie then began having prayer meetings in her own home.
