He was born on November 10, 1962 in Salisbury, Maryland to Lula Johnson and the late Lester Elwood Collick, Sr. He was joined in Holy matrimony to Gwendolyn McCaskill.

"Seat" was educated in the public schools of Worcester and Somerset Counties. He was a 1980 graduate of Washington High School in Princess Anne, Maryland.
