Levi Silvils (Sabir), son of the late Levi Silvils Sr. and Hattie Saunders was born on May 27, 1932, Norfolk, VA. He transitioned from this life on July 26, 2017 in Dover, Delaware.

Levi loved socializing with friends and family. He loved to sing, play his guitar, and watch cowboy movies. He also loved to eat good foods. Levi loved to spend quality time with his companion, his little dog, Missy. Levi was a well-dressed man. He took great pride in how he dressed. He was generous and kind to everyone. He served faithfully in the US Navy until he was honorably discharged in 1972. Levi worked many years for Garden Paper Company in Norfolk, VA. He then went on to be the first black African man to establish a paper converting company in the state of Florida. Levi attended and graduated from William C. Jason High School in Georgetown, Delaware. Following graduation he attended Delaware State University.

Levi is preceded in death by his parents, Levi Silvils Sr., and Hattie Saunders; three aunts, Doris Horton, Mildred Stewart, and Margaret Saunders; two uncles, Grady Love and John Jones.
