Manchester Brisco, Jr. took his flight on Monday, January 25, 2016 at his home in Havre De Grace, MD.

Manchester was born in Eastville, Northampton County, VA on August 17, 1953 to Manchester, Sr. and the late Bishop Mollie Brisco. He was the eldest of four children born to this union.

He attended Cape Henlopen High School and graduated with the class of 1971. Manchester enlisted in the United States Army serving six years both active and Army Reserves. After serving his country, he held numerous occupations from the food to environmental service industries. After relocating to Maryland, he was employed at the Veterans Administration Hospital, Perry Point, MD where he worked for 17 years as Supervisor of Environmental Management Services.
