Marian “Sis” Prattis Dexter Smith, age 76 of Bridgeville, Delaware, died peacefully at her home on Monday, December 19, 2016, after a long struggle with cancer. Marian was born on Thursday, July 25, 1940 in Chester, Pennsylvania, the daughter of the late Lillie L. Prattis and William Russell Prattis. She was the loving sister to three siblings; the late Louise Smith, Mildred Weal and Charles Cephas.

In addition to her parents and siblings, she was preceded in death by her husband, Daniel Smith, Jr., whom she affectionately referred to as “Hun”. They were married for 23 years and separated by death, four days short of the one-year anniversary of Daniel’s passing.

Marian’s elementary education was obtained at Phillis Wheatley School in Bridgeville, Delaware. Marian attended school at William C. Marian loved the Lord and was a dedicated member of Mt. Calvary United Methodist Church, Bridgeville, Delaware. She always had a praise in her

mouth, encouraging words for the youth and a testimony to share with all that would hear. She lived out her faith by opening the doors of her home to numerous foster children for more than 20 years, many of whom are here today to celebrate her life and the opportunities she provided them.

Marian enjoyed traveling and every time her children traveled, Marian somehow ended up in the car, plane or cruise ship. If you ever stopped by to visit her between 11:00 am - 1:30 pm you knew what you were in store for (The Price is Right & The Young & Restless) so you had to get to the point quickly. If you couldn't catch her at home, you would find her at the Seaford Walmart- always with a smile, a hug and a word of encouragement.
