Marjorie loved to cook and she was well known for making rolls, German's Sweet Chocolate Cake, Lemon Pound Cake and her special Sweet Potato Pies.

Marjorie had a passion for gardening. Her favorite flower was the Rhododendron. Her front yard was landscaped with lavender and red rhododendron shrubs meticulously placed. Her annual spring ritual was going to the nursery in Denton to buy more rhododendrons. She also had a keen eye for home decorating.
