



## Mark Brummell

June 19, 1969 - April 6, 2019

On April 6, 2019, at the age of 49, the Lord sent angels down to give Pastor Brummell his well-earned wings into the Kingdom of Heaven. Mark “Ted” Brummell, was born on June 19, 1969, in Preston, Maryland. He was the son of Ocie Lily Brummell, and the late Melvin S. Brummell, Sr.

Mark attended William Penn High School, Class of 1988. He won the Most Athletic Award in high school and was a professional body builder, benching over 500 pounds. He worked at Highmark Blue Cross for 19 years. Some of Ted’s favorite activities were watching his beloved football team, the Philadelphia Eagles, drinking his morning coffee while reading his Bible, preaching on Facebook Live, watching zombie movies, and spending time with his daughters, granddaughter, and family.

From 2000 to 2010, Mark served under Bishops Peterson Sr. and Jr. at Bible Way Church in Harrisburg. In 2011, God called him to start his own ministry at Spring Creek Rehabilitation and Healthcare Center, for four years. One of his favorite pastors was Minister and Bishop Noel Jones of City of Refuge Church in California. Mark had a passion for traveling and had big dreams of opening his own homeless shelter to help those less fortunate, while spreading the word of the Lord.

In addition to his father, Mark is preceded in death by his brother, Malcom

Brummell and his grandmother, Marjorie M. Brummell-Jones.

Mark is survived by his two beautiful daughters, Olivia Green and Markea Brummell, and his beautiful granddaughter, LaNiya, all of Harrisburg, PA. Ted is also survived by his brothers, Melvin S. Brummell, Jr., Manuel Brummell, Marvin D. Brummell, Michael Brummell, Matthew Brummell; two sisters, Mashell Harris and Malinda Brummell; along with a host of nieces, nephew, cousins, other relatives, and friends.
