Mark R. Volker of Millsboro, Delaware, passed July 20th 2017 at the age of 66. Mark, formerly of Harleysville and Norristown, PA, died after a courageous battle with lung cancer at Delaware Hospice Center surrounded by family. Mark graduated from Tusculum College, in Tennessee, with a degree in sociology. Mark owned and operated West End Beer Baron in West Norriton Pennsylvania, for many years. After, he managed 2 Sbarros restaurants and Nathans famous in King of Prussia Pennsylvania. He worked for Thermo-Fisher Scientific and VWR International as a stock room manager, on-site, at Glaxo Smith Kline up until his retirement in 2015.
