She worked at Peninsula Oil in the Accounting Department until her medical retirement. She moved to Reading, Pennsylvania to assist in the care of her eldest son's children Trey and Shay, and then later moved to Cambridge, MD to assist her

youngest son with the care of his children Cayla & Lamont, Jr. While in Cambridge she joined Living by Truth Ministries, rededicated her life to Christ and became an active member providing immeasurable assistance to her son and daughter Pastor Lamont and Co-Pastor Mia Jackson. She served as Financial Secretary until her transition. Marlyn said "I know God sent me here to help my son". She was dearly known by the LTM Family as "Mom Marlyn." Marlyn leaned heavily on the Lord for strength, courage and hope.
