Marshall Gilbert Scarborough, Sr., son of the late Robert Scarborough and Hattie Beatrice Douglas, was called home on Thursday, May 14, 2026, at his home in Pocomoke City, Maryland after a short illness.

Marshall, Eurp, Scarborough, Pops, or Pop-Pop as he was affectionately called, was born on April 22, 1939 in Accomack County, Virginia, where he was also educated. At an early age, he attended Ebenezer Baptist Church in Wardtown, Virginia.

Marshall found his true love, Catherine Douglas, and they united as one on September 7, 1963. From this union, two children were born.
